Diocesan History; We are very proud to offer you the opportunity of owning a copy of "GOOD NEWS FOR THE EAST MIDLANDS, *an account of the background to, and the story of, the Diocese of Nottingham.*" Canon Anthony Dolan, a retired priest and former archivist of our diocese, has, together with many other contributors, compiled this book which contains more than 360 pages of information and photographs about our parishes, religious communities, schools, pilgrimage sites and martyrs. A limited number of copies of the book are available in the church, to purchase at a reduced price of £16.00. We hope you will enjoy reading this fascinating book, the first history of our diocese to be published since 1950.

Eucharistic Congress-Keynote speaker; Bishop Barron's pioneering work in evangelising through the new media led Francis Cardinal George to describe him as "one of the Church's best messengers." He has keynoted many conferences and events all over the world, including the 2016 World Youth Day in Kraków, Poland and the 2015 World Meeting of Families in Philadelphia, which marked Pope Francis' historic visit to the United States. In 2017, he was also invited to speak on religion to employees at Facebook's headquarters. Bishop Barron's website, <https://www.wordonfire.org/> reaches millions of people each year, and he is one of the world's most followed Catholics on social media. His regular YouTube videos have been viewed over 25 million times and he has over 1.5 million followers on Facebook. Prayer to the Holy Trinity

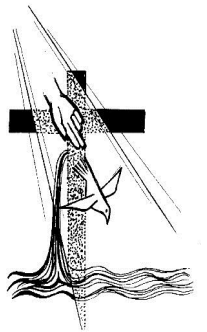

Corpus Christi Feast Day Celebration: Please join us for our Holy Hour of Adoration and reflection before the Blessed Sacrament on this Coming Week after the Mass from Monday 28th May to Friday 1st of June. Corpus Christi Church celebrates their Patronal feast day on this Sunday, therefore after the 6.00pm Vigil Holy Mass and at 11.am Holy Mass on 2nd of June, there will be a procession of the Blessed Sacrament in the Church.

St Barnabas Cathedral; This June will see a four-day Music Festival held at the Cathedral, inspired by the centenaries of the end of the First World War and the passing of the 1918 Representation of the People Act, which gave some women the right to vote. We will be welcoming international musicians such as Roderick Williams, Iain Burnside and the all-female a cappella group Papagena to the Cathedral as well as local musicians Essentially Brass. The centre-piece to the Festival is the semi-stage performance of 'Tobias and the Angel' a church opera by Jonathan Dove and David Lan. This will involve children and young people from Music for Everyone, both our Cathedral Choirs, the Helix Ensemble, and Street-wise Opera - a national organisation which works with those who have experienced homelessness. The story is from the Book of Tobit in the Apocrypha and among the themes explored are the nature of faith and the redemptive power of love.
