Time to learn more about the Ancient Egyptians and create art just like Picasso!

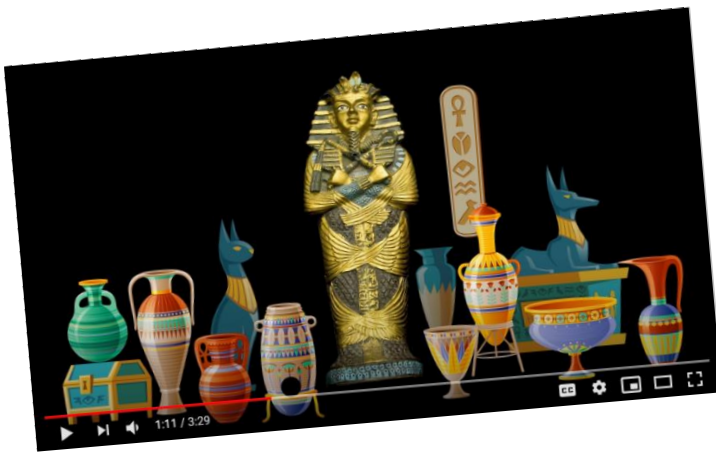

NOW FOR A PICASSO RECAP!

Remember, Picasso found a new, exciting and different way to paint, known as **Cubism!**

This became the style of painting that Picasso made famous! The images below are Cubist paintings! Look closely - it looks like an image broken up into little cubes. That's where the name Cubism came from! Over time, Picasso began to make his paintings **look clearer** in order for people to have an idea of what he had painted, appear **flatter**



and **much more colourful**. Cubism is now known as one of the most powerful and important periods in the history of modern art.

Can you work out what the images are to the left and the right?

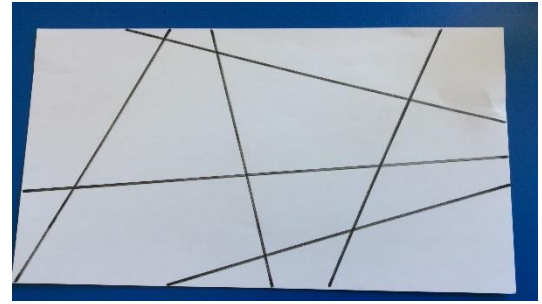


YOUR TASK

Use **Ancient Egyptian** images to create **Picasso Cubism** art work!

1. The Background

Take a plain sheet of paper and draw some lines diagonally across it using a thick, dark pen/pencil.
Tip: Don't draw too many diagonal lines!



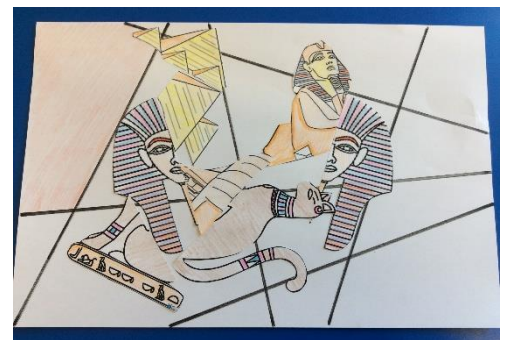
2. Now use the sheet attached which has the four Ancient Egyptian images on. Colour each one in and cut each one out. (You could draw your own instead of using the printed sheet if you wanted)



3. Cut your images up into around 2/3 pieces.



4. Layer these on the diagonal-lined paper however you wish. The more higgledy-piggledy, the better!



5. Colour in any of the background shapes using 2/3 colours.
