<p>Create your very own 3D model Clifton Village! Or can you recreate a replica building in the Clifton/Clifton Village? The Dovecote, Clifton Hall...?</p> <p><i>Label the key features and explain how was created, as well as the story behind them. Use any medium you like!</i></p>	<p>Bake / a Victorian, floral cake (with adult support!) to celebrate William Morris and write a set of instructions to go with it.</p> <p><i>Use an instructional/recipe layout (ingredients, hints/tips, steps, pictures, captions, diagrams). You could even video yourself making it!</i></p>	<p>Have a go at creating a textile project using the skill of sewing. Floral patterns will be a focus next term...perhaps a floral design using different stitches? Maybe you could 'upcycle' some old clothes?</p> <p><i>Write an explanation of how you created your textile project. And remember to get adult permission and supervision!</i></p>
<p>Create a biography about the Victorian artist, William Morris.</p> <p><i>Tell us all about his early life, later life and what he is most famous for, as well as his lasting legacy. Ensure it is written to a high standard and is display ready!</i></p>	<p>Create a double page, colourful thinking board on solids, liquids and gases for science.</p> <p><i>Use correct terminology and use the internet to include extra facts (no copy &amp; paste!). Pictures always help the reader! No gaps allowed!</i></p>	<p>Create a piece of art that links to William Morris. This could be a section of his wallpaper or a stained glass window.</p> <p><i>It could be 2D or 3D, and have an art commentary written alongside it!</i></p>
<p>Research famous landmarks of Clifton and Nottingham. What are some of the most famous places, buildings and statues?</p> <p><i>Present it anyway you like e.g. PowerPoint, written information text, a mini-book, a tourist information video advert?! etc.</i></p>	<p>Create an Eco fact sheet all about Fairtrade Fortnight!</p> <p><i>Research renewable types of energy and answer this question: why do we have a duty to ensure that the energy we use is renewable?</i></p>	<p>Create a PowerPoint about WW1.</p> <p><i>Use correct terminology and use the internet to include extra facts (no copy &amp; paste!). Pictures and quotes always help the reader!</i></p>
<p>Read a book over half term and create a book review, so that it can encourage others to read it.</p> <p><i>Summarise what happened in your book and why you liked it, using correct terminology and punctuation throughout. This will go on the reading display!</i></p>
